

1914

Lieutenant Maurice James Dease

4th Royal Fusiliers killed in action 23 August 1914 age 24. Received the Victoria Cross. Son of Edmund F. and Katherine M. Dease of Levington, Mullingar, County Westmeath, Ireland. One of the first British Officer battle casualties of the war and the first posthumous recipient of the V.C. of the war. An Extract from the London Gazette dated 16 November 1914 records the following. Though two or three times badly wounded he continued to control the fire of his machine guns at Mons on the 23rd August until all his men were shot. He died of his wounds. Buried at St. Symphorien Military Cemetery, France.

Lieutenant George Archer-Shee

3rd attached to the 2nd South Staffordshire Regiment killed in action 31 October 1914 age 19 Son of Martin and Helen Archer-Shee. George was born in Bristol his father was a Bank of England, agent. He studied at Stonyhurst College and Royal Naval College, Osborne. Was the subject of Terence Rattigan's play "The Winslow Boy". Commemorated on the Menin Gate Memorial, Ypres, Belgium.

Signaller Basil Thomas Martin.

2nd Battalion, Yorkshire Regiment. He died on November 1st aged 20. His parents came from Minchinhampton and lived in Swindon. His brother is also remembered on the Wayside Cross

Private Frederick Shipton.

1st Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment., B Company. Service No. 8343. He died of wounds on November 11th aged 30. He was born at Horsley in 1884 the son of William Shipton and Emily, nee Barnes of Shortwood Green, and enlisted at Stroud. Married to Clara Mary nee Rudge of 1, Crown Court, Ebley, Stroud, Gloucestershire He is commemorated on the Menin Gate memorial, France. *This memorial has his surname as "Skipton"*

Private William J. King.

1st Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment Service No 7318. He died on November 15th age 27. He is commemorated on the Menin Gate Memorial, Ypres, Belgium.

Captain George R. Wyld.

3rd Battalion, Wiltshire Regiment. He died on 24th December aged 37. He was the son of the vicar of Melksham.

1915

Hardinge Stather Dunn.

Rifleman, 9th London Regiment, Queen Victoria's Rifles. Service No. 1611. He died of wounds on January 4th aged 19. He was the son of Harry Stather and Constance Theodora of 19 Laudesdale Mansions, Paddington, London. He is buried in Wulverghem-Lindenhoek Military Cemetery, Belgium.

This memorial has his rank as Lieutenant but all records show him as Rifleman.

The memorial gives the year as 1916

Rifleman Francis E. Partridge.,

3rd Battalion, Kings Royal Rifle Corps Service No 8299. He died on 15th February aged 40 son of James and Sarah of The Leazes, Stroud. He is commemorated on the Menin Gate Memorial, Ypres, Belgium

Lance Corporal Albert Child

1st/2nd Battalion, Worcestershire Regiment. Service No. 119. He died on March 13th, aged 22. He was the son of Marie E. Child of Downend, Horsley and the late George Child. He was also commemorated at Le Touret Memorial, France, on the Nailsworth War Memorial and on the Shortwood Chapel plaque at Christ Church.

Private James Campbell

13th Cheshire Regiment Service No. 753. He died of wounds in Stroud hospital on 14 April 1915. He is buried at Stroud Old Cemetery, Gloucestershire. He was a native Fintona, Tyrone, Ireland and had no family according to his funeral report.

Private Aloysius Mobley.

5th Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment Service No 2229. He died on 5th May aged 24. He was born in Warwick and his parents lived in Gloucester.

Private Frederick Alder.

1st Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. He died on May 9th, aged 35. His parents lived in Woodchester.

Private Alfred William Hyde.

1st Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 2002. He was born in Amberley, enlisted in Stroud and was killed in action on May 9th, aged 23. He was the son of Edward and Ellen Hyde of Box near Minchinhampton. He is commemorated on the Le Touret Memorial, France

Stephen Ealey.

His name is misspelt as "Caley" on the memorial. He is believed to be Stephen Ealey from Horsley. He died on May 10th.

Private William E. Holbrow (Holborow)

2nd Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 10081. He was born in Nailsworth, enlisted in Stroud and killed in action on May 10th aged 18. He is commemorated on the Menin Gate Memorial, Ypres, Belgium. He was the son of George and Ellen Holbrow of Rowden, Hazel Wood, Nailsworth. He is also remembered on the Nailsworth War Memorial.

Private William C. Richings.

2nd Battalion, Grenadier Guards. Service No 15172. He was killed in action on May 17th aged 21. His parents, William and Catherine lived at Longmans in Avening. He is buried at Guards cemetery, Windy Corner, Cuinchy, France

Private William Leonard Stevens_(or Stephens)

10th (or 2nd) Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 9195. He was born c. 1891 in Minchinhampton, enlisted in Bristol and died of his wounds on May 30th. His parents, Leonard and Prudence, lived at Northfields Woodchester. He is buried in Boulogne Eastern Cemetery. He is also remembered on the Nailsworth War Memorial. *The memorial gives the year as 1916.*

Private Bert Harrison.

4th Worcestershire Regiment. Service No. 10296. He was born 1886 in Nailsworth, son of Daniel Clark Harrison and Salome nee Clifford of Forest Green. He died of his wounds on May 31st aged 29 and is buried in Twelve Tree Copse Cemetery, Turkey. He is also remembered on the Nailsworth War Memorial and on the Forest Green Chapel plaque at Christ Church.

The wrong date, June 6th 1916, is on the memorial.

Private Harold Vincent (Jack) Angell

5th Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 2426. He died of wounds on June 13th aged 18. He was born in Stroud; enlisted in Swindon. His parents lived in Lancaster Gate, London but had run the Rowcroft Hotel in Stroud

Sergeant Edward Davies.

9th Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 2717. He was born at Chalford, enlisted in Bristol and died at home on July 17th, aged 43. He is buried at St Matthew's Churchyard, Cainscross near Stroud, Gloucestershire.

The CWGC have is rank as Colour Sergeant.

Engine Room Artificer Alfred Hunt.

Royal Navy Submarine Company 33. He died on August 5th aged 29. He was the son of Alfred and Annie of Bowbridge Lane, Stroud. He is commemorated on the Portsmouth Naval Memorial

2nd Lieutenant Geoffrey R. Johnson.

7th Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. He died of his wounds on August 7th aged 23. His parents lived in Chalford in 1911.

The GWGC has his age as 22

Private Laurence N. Wilkinson.

5th Battalion, Shropshire Regiment. Service No. 16156. He was born in Stroud and died on September 15th. His wife lived in Manchester. He was the son of Charles Feaster Wilkinson and Kate of Kings Stanley. He is buried at Lijssenthoek Military Cemetery, Belgium.

Private G.H.Hanks.

10th Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 17385. He died on September 25th aged 35. His wife lived in Horsley. He is also remembered on the Horsley War Memorial and the Nailsworth War Memorial.

Private Edward E. Leigh

1st Battalion, South Wales Borderers Service No 6828. He died on September 26th aged 32. His wife lived in Nailsworth. He is also remembered on the Nailsworth War Memorial.

The T.N.A. has his rank as Lance Corporal.

Corporal Wallace W. Grey

10th Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 13621. He was born in Minchinhampton, enlisted in Stroud and died of his wounds on September 27th aged 21. His parents lived in Avening.

Private (Ernest) Edward Cuss.

1st Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 18815. He died of his wounds on October 9th, aged 24. He was born in Minchinhampton and enlisted in Bristol.

His date is given as October 11th on the memorial.

Sergeant Thomas Wyndham Trussler.

10th Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 12451. He was born in Mells Somerset, enlisted in Stroud and died of his wounds on October 27th aged 21. He was the son of Abel and Louisa Trussler, of St. Chloe Green, Amberley, Gloucestershire and brother of Albert and Percy both of whom fell and are remembered on this memorial. He is buried at Etaples Military Cemetery, France.

Private Charles Edward Bingle

8th

Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No.13664. He was killed in action on November 3rd aged 22. He was the son of Joseph E and Charlotte M of Burleigh near Stroud. He is commemorated on the Loos Memorial, France.

Sapper Ralph John Dee.

70th Field Company, Royal Engineers. Service No. 42073. He died on December 8th aged 19. His parents lived in Avening.

Private Walter Ernest Davis.

12th Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 14491. He was born at Ebley, enlisted at Bristol and died of his wounds on December 31st. aged 34. He was the son of Richard Miles and Mary Ann Davis who lived in Ebley and husband of Kate Louise of 178, Stapleton Road, Bristol. He is buried at St Sever Cemetery, Rouen, France.

1916

Corporal Herbert (Hubert?) W. Cox.

8th Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 17674. He was born in Gloucester and enlisted in Stroud and died of his wounds on January 4th aged 27. He was the son of Edward and Catherine Sarah, nee Phipps, of Box, Minchinhampton, Gloucestershire, and the husband of Minnie, nee Jones, also of Box. He is buried in Etaples Military Cemetery, France.

Ernest Charles Beale.

Driver, 119097, 18th Reserve, Royal Field Artillery. He was born about 1897 Nailsworth, son of Henry Beale and Caroline, nee Browning. He died in Exeter Isolation Hospital of meningitis on 7th February aged 19, and is buried in Exeter High Cemetery, grave 27. He is also remembered on Nailsworth War Memorial and on the Forest Green Chapel plaque at Christ Church.

CWGC have him listed as Charles Ernest

2nd Lieutenant Lionel Palling.

Royal Fusiliers. He was killed in action on March 15th. He was the son of Henry Verney and Mary Georgina of Stroud, Gloucestershire. He is buried at the Vermelles British Cemetery, France

Private Charles Stewart Strange.

Assistant Paymaster, 41 H.M.T. President, Royal Navy. He died on April 22nd 1916 age 32. He was the son of Joseph and Mary of Hackney, London and brother of A.L Strange, 197 Ashley Gardens, Westminster, London. He is buried in the Ste Marie Cemetery, Le Havre, France.

Sergeant Frank Smith.

7th Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 8310. He was born c. 1887 at St. Mark's Gloucester and enlisted in Gloucester. He was killed in action in Mesopotamia on April 23rd (or 21st),

aged 29. He was the son of Joseph and Fanny. He was married to Cecilia Anne, nee Barnes. He is commemorated on the Basra Memorial, Mesopotamia and the Nailsworth War Memorial.

Private Harry Malpas.

16th Battalion, Cheshire Regiment Service No 21821. He died on April 28th age 23. He was the son of Thomas and Minnie of Worm Hill, Horsley, Gloucestershire. He is buried in the Merville Communal Cemetery, France.

Corporal Walter Fruin.

10th Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 12430. He was born in Woodchester enlisted in Stroud and died of his wounds on April 30th aged 20. He was the son of Frederick and Hannah of Little London, Kings Court, Rodborough. He was buried in the Abberville Communal Cemetery, France. He worked at Mr Workman's wood yard in Woodchester.

Captain Eric Maudslay Simpson.

9th Battalion, Worcestershire Regiment. He died on May 2nd aged 34. He was born in Lincolnshire, married in 1910 at Kensington and is buried at Amara War Cemetery, Iraq He was the son of John and Emilie (1911 census gave her place of birth as South Australia) of Skirbeck, Lincolnshire. He was mentioned in despatches

Private Harry Bristow

6th Battalion, Dorset Regiment Service No 15856. He died on May 5th aged 22. He was a native of Henfield Sussex. His parents lived in Nailsworth. He is buried in Bailleul Communal Cemetery, France. He is also remembered on family gravestone at Amberley and the Nailsworth War Memorial. *The "UK, Soldiers Died in the Great War" names him Henry*

Private Henry Middleditch.

1/5th Gloucestershire Regiment. He was killed in action on May 13th aged 21. He was the son of George and Louisa Harriet of 18 Upper Lypiatt Terrace, Horns Road, Stroud. He is buried in the Ploegsteert Wood Military Cemetery, Belgium.

Charles Holbrow (Holborow)

Stoker 1st Class, HMS Black Prince, Royal Navy. Service No.K/23928. He was born in 1894 in Horsley, the son of George Holbrow (spelling varies) and Ellen, nee Scales, of Rowden, Hazel Wood, Nailsworth. He was lost with HMS Black Prince on May 31st, aged 20. He was the brother of William Ernest, who had been killed on May 10th 1915. He is commemorated on the Portsmouth Naval Memorial, and also remembered on the Nailsworth War Memorial.

Ernest Lloyd.

Cameron Highlanders. He died on June 4th aged 40.

The CWGC, TNA and the "UK Soldiers that died in the Great War" have been researched and he was not found. He may be the following:

Private, 43rd Canadian Infantry (Manitoba Regiment) Cameron Highlanders of Canada Service No.153355. He died on 3rd June 1916, aged 41. He was the husband of Ellen Lloyd of 4, Pretoria Terrace, Alston Croft, Cheltenham, and son of Albert and Jane of Cheltenham. His birth name was Ernest Albert born 1875. He is buried at Perth Cemetery, China Wall, Belgium.

He may have left his wife and children after the 1911 census and enlisted in Manitoba as Ernest Blick.

He deducted 6 years from his age presumably so he would be accepted.

He also claimed to be single and gave his next of kin as his married sister who lived in Cheltenham.

Sergeant George Edward Wright

12th Royal Rifle Brigade. Service No. S/3589. He was killed in action on June 6th, aged 27. He was born at Forwood, Minchinhampton on 25th. Dec 1889, the son of Albert and Annie M Wright of 2, Union St. Minchinhampton. He had 4 sisters and 2 brothers. He was married in Liverpool in 1913 and lived there. He is buried at the Potijze Burial Ground Cemetery, Leper, West Vlaanderen, Belgium. *The memorial has his date as June 7th.*

Corporal Henry (Harry) Edward Smith.

1st Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 1457. He was born in Minchinhampton enlisted in Stroud and killed in action on June 9th aged 22. He is buried at the Loos British Cemetery, France.

Private Charles Henry (Franklin) Harding.

1st Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 2010. He had two names. He was born in Exeter enlisted in Stroud and was killed in action on June 10th aged 20. He was the son of Lewis William and Elizabeth Jane Franklin, of 39 Middle Hill Stroud. His mother appears as Jane Harding, Jane Franklin, Elizabeth Franklin and Elizabeth J Franklin. He is recorded as Charles Henry Harding and Charles Franklin. His step father was Charles Henry Franklin a building labourer and ex-soldier who served in India and South Africa and as an army reservist in the First World War. He is buried in the Loos British Cemetery, France.

Corporal Leonard Coverdale.

12th Battalion, York & Lancaster Regiment. Service No 121626. He died aged 25 on July 1st, the first day of the Somme. He was the son of Thomas Charles and Emily of Church Farm, Hollm Yorkshire. He is commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial, Somme France.

Private Eric Martin

10th Queen's Own Royal West Kent Regiment, formerly 12820, 25 Border regiment. Service no. G/16342. He died on July 1st aged 24 (*or* 25) William Eric was the son of William James and Emily, Flat 5, 123 Victoria Street, Westminster, London and brother of Basil who also fell. William was born in Colchester and is buried in the Tancrez Farm Cemetery, Belgium.

Corporal Wilfred James Brinkworth

8th Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 13656. He was born in Woodchester, enlisted in Stroud and killed in action on July 3rd aged 22. He was the son of Henry William and Emma of Amberley. He is commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial, Somme. He is named James on the Wayside Cross.

Private Percy F. Click.

8th Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No 13053. He was killed in action on July 3rd. He was the son of Charles and Charlotte of St Chloe, Stroud, Gloucestershire, and husband of Ivy L. He is commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial, Somme, France.

Lieutenant Richard William Jennings

“C” Company 10th Battalion, Worcestershire Regiment. He died of his wounds which he received at La Boisselle on July 3rd aged 27. He was rescued from the battlefield by Private Thomas Turrell, who received the Victoria Cross. He was the son of Rev Arthur Charles and Georgina Isabella Jennings of King’s Stanley Rectory. He was Cambridge Lightweight Boxing Champion 1909-1910: B.A and L.L.B [Cantab]. He was entered on the Roll of Solicitors July. He is buried at Meaulte Military Cemetery, France. He was mentioned in despatches.

Lance Corporal Wallace Charles Marsh.

8th Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No 13654 He was born in Amberley enlisted in Stroud and killed in action on July 3rd aged 30. His parents lived in Amberley. He is commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial, Somme, France

Private Rollo Peter Steele.

9th Battalion, Manchester Regiment, previously East Surrey Regiment. Service No. 17657. He died on July 14th aged 21. He was the son of Philip Richard and Ethel Gertrude of 58 Crotham Road, South Croydon. Hampshire. He is commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial.

Private Ernest Mills.

5th Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 2856. He was born in Stroud enlisted in Gloucester and killed in action on July 23rd. He is buried at Pozieres British Cemetery, Ovillers-La Boisselle, France.

Private William Pash.

10th Battalion Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 24313. He was born and enlisted in Nailsworth and was killed in action on July 23rd, aged 20. He is also commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial, the Nailsworth War Memorial and the Shortwood Chapel plaque at Christ Church.

Sergeant William Henry Mills.

10th Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 15521. He was born in Horsley enlisted in Bristol and was killed in action on July 23rd.

Private Arthur George Harris.

5th Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 4101. He was born in Nailsworth enlisted in Stroud and died of wounds on July 26th aged 19. He was the son of George and Alice Maria of Nailsworth, Gloucestershire. He is buried at the Warloy-Baillon Communal Cemetery Extension, France. *On the memorial the date is given as July 25th.*

Sergeant Cyril John Worrad.

Royal Army Ordinance Corps. He was a Dominican brother at Woodchester Priory. He died on August 6th aged 22. His parents lived in Leicester and he is buried in Welford Rd Cemetery Leicester,

Private Henry Charles Allway.

1st Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 10987. He was born in Horsley, enlisted in Stroud and killed in action on August 22nd aged 23. He was the son of Charles and Annie of Downend, Horsley. He is commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial, Somme France.

Private John Henry (Jack) Quinn.

1st Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 19169. He worked in the Priory garden, enlisted

in Bristol and killed in action on August 24th aged 20. He is buried in Caterpillar Valley Cemetery, France. He is also remembered (as Jack) on the Nailsworth War Memorial

Private John William Hitchings.

8th Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 15236. He was born and enlisted in Stroud and killed in action on August 31st aged 34 (not 36 *as on the memorial*) in Belgium. He was the son of Alfred and Elizabeth of Bisley Old Road, Stroud. He is buried in the Wulverghem-Linenhoek Road Military Cemetery, Belgium.

Private Charles E. Browning.

3rd Battalion, Worcestershire Regiment. Service No. 29070. He was born and enlisted in Stroud and died on September 3rd aged 24. He was the son of Nathan and Emily of Rose Bank, London Road, Stroud. He is commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial, Somme

Rifleman Francis G. Bull.

14th Battalion Rifle Brigade. He died on September 3rd aged 21. He was the son of Mr & Mrs Bull of Burton on Trent.

Private Percival Richard Horton.

1st Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 9689. He was born in Alberta, Canada enlisted in Gloucester and killed in action on September 8th aged 22. He was the son of Frank and Clara of Kingscourt, Stroud. He is buried at Delville Wood Cemetery, Longueval, France.
On the memorial the date given is December 8th.

Lance Corporal Frederick Lewis

Bugler, 1st Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 10141, also Trumpeter, Royal Glos Hussars Yeomanry. Service number 235387. He was born in Nailsworth in c.1893, the son of John and Laura Ann, nee Timbrell, of Forest Green. He enlisted in Bristol and was killed in action on August 16th, aged 23. He is also remembered on the Nailsworth memorial and the Jerusalem Memorial, Israel. *CWGC gives him as Bugler who died on August 16th. On the memorial August 15th is given.*

Rifleman Harold Jones

8th Battalion, (Post Office Rifles) London Regiment Service No 4278. He died on September 15th aged 23. He was the son of Henry and Louisa of Bath Place, Stroud. He is buried in Caterpillar Valley Cemetery, Longueval France.

Walter Ralph.

1st Battalion, Canadian Mounted Rifles, Saskatchewan Regiment. Rifleman 136120. He died on September 15th, aged 24 He was the son of Frank and Clara of 7 Jubilee Road, Lower Ashley Road, Bristol. He is commemorated on the Vimy Memorial, France

Rifleman Arthur Edward Smith.

Rifle Brigade. Rifleman, S/4422 He was killed in action on September 15th aged 28. He is commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial, France

Lieutenant Edward S Langdale.

This memorial has the following: Edward S Langdale Lieutenant, Royal Engineers died 14 October 1916 age 31, but this name is not listed with the CWGC, UK Soldiers Died in the Great War, or the T.N.A. Medal Rolls. Instead these sites have the following: *Lieutenant Edward Francis Joseph Stourton-Langdale, 233rd Field Company, Royal Engineers killed in action, 5 October 1916 age 32.*

He was the son of Arthur and Catherine Langdale, nee de Bruin, of 45, Church Rd., Barnes, London. He is buried at A.I.F. Burial Ground, Flers, France.

Private John Christopher St. George MM.

2nd Battalion, South African Infantry. Service No. 5599 He died on October 15th aged 20. He was the son of Theophilus John and Florence of 3 Burger Street, Pietermaritzburg, Natal, South Africa. He is buried at the Dernancourt Communal Cemetery Extension, France

Private Henry Essex.

West Yorkshire Regiment. Service No 31963. He died on November 10th aged 19. He was a novice at Woodchester Priory and son of William Charles and Sarah Ann Leeds. He was a native of Hull and is buried in the Sailly-Au-Bois Military Cemetery, France as Brother Urban Essex O.P.

Private James Henry Rothwell.

38th Canadian Infantry, Eastern Ontario Regiment. Service No. 410186. He died on November 18th aged 22. He was the son of Thomas and Mary E of 623 Halifax Road, Wardle, Lancaster. He is commemorated on the Vimy Memorial, France

Private Bernard Curtis.

8th Somerset Light Infantry. 19208, 9th Battalion He died aged 28 on 19 November 1916 .He was born at Malmesbury. He is commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial, France.
This memorial has his date of death as 19 November 1917.

Private E.A.G. Gabb.

7th Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No 10773. He came from King's Stanley. He was wounded at Gallipoli and discharged earlier in 1916. He died in Stroud on November 23rd aged 22.
Not listed with the CWGC but he can be found on the "Soldiers of Gloucestershire" web site.

Private William Ernest Brinkworth.

2nd/5th Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 4635. He was born in Nailsworth, enlisted in Gloucester and killed in action on December 24th aged 22. He was the son of Ernest Albert and Hattie Eliza Brinkworth of Bristol Road, Nailsworth. He is commemorated at Regina Trench Cemetery, Grandcourt, France, on the Nailsworth War Memorial and on his mother's grave at Shortwood Baptist Graveyard.

Lieutenant Frithoy Harold Asche.

4th Battalion, Australian Imperial Forces. He died on January 31st aged 37. He is buried at Cite Bonjean Military Cemetery, Armentieres. His brother Oscar Asche was an Actor/Manager and for a time owned a farm at Downend Horsley

Lance Corporal William Philip Healey
