




Residents of The Millpond and others raised objection to proximity of play area to their homes


WMBT Fencing

Organic Play



'organic' play area

unlike anything else in this area

traditional play equipment such as metal swings, slides, carousels and climbing frames tend to be proscriptive, and are focused on specific physical skills

we want to offer our children a play area where the type of play is freely chosen by the children - driven by imagination, personally directed and intrinsically motivated

these are considered more challenging and allow for a mix of physical development, creative development, social skills and the development of independence and risk awareness

bespoke play equipment, much of it made from locally sourced wind-fall timber



Conclusions

Based on the results of laboratory testing, sampled soil is considered to be uncontaminated. It is important to note that this is based on the assumption that the site will be used as a public park, therefore, should an alternative use be proposed, the risk to human health may need to be re-evaluated.


